   Community engagement in green space development along the Lower LA River

Highlights:

- Safety issues on the southern Los Angeles River path meeting Shoreline Realignment.
- Goal is to connect northern areas with Downtown via bike and walking paths.
- Concerns regarding homeless encampments.
- Attempt to create a more enjoyable experience along the river.
- Connecting with the Drake/Chavez Park master pan.
- Gonzalez: The DTLB Alliance could serve as the connector between disparate elements of this project and bring awareness to this project.
- Developments would enable further activations and connected spaces.
- Need additional awareness and communication to spread the word to the community.
  - Beach: Stresses the importance of digital/informational developments (HLP).
  - Rivera: Onus is placed on residents to inform themselves. Street canvassing would benefit efforts.
