

Election Safety - Residents



The City of Long Beach is working to ensure that election-related activity occurs with no disruption. We encourage everyone to report suspicious or criminal activity by calling 9-1-1 or LBPD's non-emergency line at (562) 435-6711.

Is the City going to close streets?

At this time, there are no credible threats that would necessitate street closures. In some areas, barricades may be pre-staged at strategic locations so they are readily available to restrict street access if needed. Equipment, including barricades, may be moved to new areas of the city as the information and our response changes.

Is the City imposing a curfew?

As of now, there is no curfew in the city. The City of Long Beach will only impose a citywide curfew if the City Manager proclaims a State of Local Emergency.

Can I/Should I go out to dinner or do other things, or should I be staying home?

Whether a resident stays home during the days following the election is a personal choice. The City remains under a Safer at Home health order, and the City continues to urge people to stay home when possible to slow the spread of COVID-19. However, outdoor dining/getting take-out, retail shopping and other services are allowed under the current Safer at Home order.

What is the City doing to prevent criminal activity in business corridors? Are all available police officers working?

All available officers are currently working and engaging with our community. Plans are being made to maximize the number of officers available over the course of the next several days.

What are the lessons learned from May 31 and what are you doing differently?

We absolutely value and protect the First Amendment right to peaceful protest, and we are here to ensure the safety of both protestors and the community. Violence and criminal activity will not be tolerated, and the City will contact business owners and the community if there is a credible cause for concern to protect people and property.

It is important to remember that the protests of May 31, and the more than 131 protests that followed, were overwhelmingly peaceful.
