On behalf of the Downtown Long Beach Alliance (DLBA), I am writing to express our strong support for the City of Long Beach's Clean California grant application for the enhancement of sections of Long Beach Boulevard, Pacific Avenue, Magnolia Avenue, and Atlantic Avenue.

The City of Long Beach has long worked to provide streets and spaces that enhance the experience for people of all ages and abilities while walking and traveling. Providing safe and attractive corridors is important to encourage non-motorized forms of transportation and provide safer connections between homes, parks, schools, and commercial areas. This grant directly works to advance the goals laid out in the Long Beach Safe Streets Action Plan by making the streets feel safer and more inviting and the Long Beach Climate Action Adoption Plan by reducing the urban heat island effect though native plantings.
