

# **Long Beach Recovery Act**

#### Overview

On March 16, 2021, the Long Beach City Council approved the Long Beach Recovery Act (LBRA) becoming one of the first major cities to approve COVID-19 recovery programs made possible through the Federal American Rescue Plan Act and other federal and State funding sources.

### LBRA includes multiple programs that will advance economic recovery through the following:

- Providing direct financial support to small businesses and nonprofits
- Providing free technical assistance to small businesses
- Marketing and promoting the City to attract tourism and conventions
- Providing digital resources to small businesses
- Marketing local businesses to generate additional foot traffic
- Much more!

## **Application Prioritization**

In order to support the most vulnerable in Long Beach, the City is prioritizing the equitable distribution of resources for LBRA small business grants. All applications will be scored using a weighted-selection process.

Businesses will be scored using a weighted-selection process to prioritize resources for diverse entrepreneurs, brick-and-mortar businesses, businesses that were in existence prior to March 2020, businesses that have not previously received grant funding from the City, and businesses located in low-and-moderate income areas.

Nonprofits will be scored using a weighted-selection process to prioritize resources for nonprofits that provide important social safety net services, serve BIPOC communities, are led by BIPOC leaders, and serve areas of the city highly-impacted by COVID-19 hospitalization rates.

## Important Dates

- March 1 Deadline for businesses to have a business license to qualify for grant funding
- March 9 Business Navigators begin outreach
- March 16 All four (4) grant applications become live on LiveStories/FORWARD platform
- **April 15** Application review begins
- May 15 Applications close for Business Relief Grants
- June 15 Applications close for Nonprofit Relief Grant
- **June 21 First funding round award notifications**
- July 15 Nonprofits must have a business license in order to receive grant funding
- **TBD** Second funding round award notifications
- TBD Third funding round award notifications for Nonprofit Relief Grant

### **LiveStories Technical Assistance**

#### Overview

The City is using a vendor, LiveStories, to provide online applications that are user-friendly and accessible. LiveStories is providing technical assistance to address any issues submitting applications through their portal.

### **ActivateLB Grants**

#### ACTIVATELB NEIGHBORHOOD ACTIVATION SEED GRANTS

Twelve seed grants of \$5,000 are available for small-scale, neighborhood, and first-time cultural activations. This grant opportunity funds Long Beach organizations conducting cultural events aimed at fostering community resilience and creative well-being within Long Beach's neighborhoods and their community members who have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19. The events must be free and open to the public. The application period begins June 21 and will close on July 21.

#### **ACTIVATELB BUSINESS ACTIVATION GRANTS**

Grants totaling \$100,000 will be distributed in \$5,000 and \$10,000 grants to support local events and promotions that increase consumer spending at local small businesses. Events and promotions must focus on commercial corridors that are not supported by a Business Improvement District and must measure impact on consumer spending and/or foot traffic. Events and promotions must be free and open to the public. The application period is from June 21 and will close on July 21.
